

# Local Plan Timetable



A local development scheme for the new local plan<sup>1</sup>

## October 2016

The council intends to replace the adopted Craven District Local Plan (1999). Details of the replacement local plan documents to be prepared and a timetable for their preparation are set out below.

### Local plan documents

Here is a list of documents that will make up the new local plan, with details of what subjects they deal with and what geographical areas they cover.

<sup>2</sup> Supplementary Planning Documents (SPD) build upon and provide more detailed advice or guidance on the policies in the local plan, without unnecessarily adding to the financial burdens on development.

<sup>3</sup> The initial phase of creating a new local plan involves discussion with stakeholders, gathering evidence, honing in on critical issues and considering options. This may include preparing and consulting on one or more pre-publication drafts.

<sup>4</sup> A final draft of the local plan is published for a 6-week period of formal public consultation and is then submitted to the Planning Inspectorate for an Examination in Public (EiP), at which the soundness of the local plan is tested.

<sup>5</sup> The local plan may be adopted (brought into use) by a resolution of the full council, following a successful EiP.
