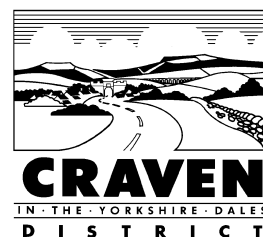

## SELECTION COMMITTEE 30 JULY 2020

### Allocation of Committee Places for Committees, Sub-Committees and Panels 2020/21



Ward(s) affected: All

Report of the Democratic Services Manager

1. **Purpose of Report** – To inform Members of the allocation of committee and panel seats under the Council's committee structure for 2020/21. The Committee is asked to recommend appointments in accordance with the Council's Constitution and the nominations of the Political Groups.
2. **Recommendations**
  - 2.1 That the Committee recommend to the Annual Meeting of Council the membership of committees (including substitute Members for Policy Committee (3) and Planning Committee (2) for each Group) and panels.
3. **Committee Membership**
  - 3.1 The distribution of seats on committees is governed by Section 15 of the Local Government and Housing Act 1989 and the Local Government (Committees and Political Groups) Regulations 1990, which require the allocation to accord with the rules on proportionality. The Council must satisfy itself each year that these rules are properly applied.
  - 3.2 The Regulations state that seats on Committees must be allocated to each political group in the same proportion to the number of seats held by each of those groups on the Council both in number on each committee and in aggregate, in so far as this may be practicable.
  - 3.3 Following the local elections on 2 May 2019, the political balance of the Council is 15 Conservative, 9 Independents, 3 Labour, 2 Green and 1 Liberal Democrat. One Independent Member is aligned to the Conservative Group. For the purpose of calculating proportionality the Conservative Group is therefore 16, Independent Group 8, Labour Group 3, Green Group 2 and Liberal Democrat 1. The Council is comprised of 30 Members. From this is derived the entitlement based on proportionality to seats on Committees as shown in the following table.

- 3.4 Based on the above calculation the allocation of seats on Committees (excluding Standards Committee, which is not included in the Regulations) to political groups on each committee would be as in the following table.

- 3.6 **Standards Committee** – Allocation of places to political groups has been based on the principle of ‘political proportionality’, however, this is not a legal requirement for the Standards Committee. Proportional allocation for a committee of 5 members would be Conservative 2.7 (3), Independent 1.3 (1), Labour 0.5 (1) Green 0.3 (0) and Liberal Democrat 0.2 (0).
- 3.7 **Audit and Governance Committee** – At Minute CL.939/16-17 Council confirmed the re-appointment of Mr Greg Robinson as the independent non-voting member of the Audit and Governance Committee for a period of three years commencing from May 2017. The Council’s Constitution (Part 3 Responsibilities of Committees) states that the Committee shall be comprised of 9 Members of the Council with the Chairman being independent of the policy element of the committee structure.
- 3.8 **Recruitment and Appeals Panel** – The Panel is comprised of three Members drawn from a pool of 10 Members; appointment to the pool is normally based on political proportionality. Proportional allocation for a committee of 10 members would be Conservative 5.3 (5), Independent 2.7 (3), Labour 1.0 (1), Green 0.7 (1) and Liberal Democrat 0.3 (0).
- 3.9 **Statutory and Senior Officers Employment Committee** – At Minute CL.732/13-14, Council approved the establishment of this Committee consisting of five elected Members. The Committee is not a standing committee of the Council but is to be constituted as a politically proportionate committee in accordance with its terms of reference. Proportional allocation for a committee of 5 members would be Conservative 2.7 (3), Independent 1.3 (1), Labour 0.5 (1) Green 0.3 (0) and Liberal Democrat 0.2 (0).
- 3.10 The following sub-committees and consultative groups are appointed by Policy Committee
- Craven Spatial Planning Sub-Committee (specific task sub-committee)
  - Craven Employees’ Consultative Group.
- 3.11 The Select Committee may appoint up to two working groups at any one time; decisions relating to appointment of those groups are a matter for that Committee.
- 3.12 Notes to assist Political Groups in submitting their recommendations to the Selection Committee are set out at Appendix B.
- 3.13 The Council has also adopted a number of conventions, which affect committee membership and these are set out at Appendix C to this report.

## APPENDIX B

### APPOINTING MEMBERS TO COMMITTEES, ETC

#### SELECTION COMMITTEE – 23 JULY 2020

The following are notes on the actions the Political Groups need to take in submitting recommendations to the Selection Committee on membership of committees etc under the committee structure.

1. **Policy Committee** – The Policy Committee comprises 15 members and will be chaired by the Leader of the Council, with the Deputy Leader as Vice-Chair. Both these offices will be appointed at the Annual Meeting of the Council on the recommendation of the Selection Committee. The membership will be politically proportional and members of this Committee will not serve on the Select (Overview and Scrutiny) Committee. Political Groups should seek, so far as is practicable, not to appoint Councillors to this Committee, who are also to be members of the Planning Committee. In particular, the Leader and the Deputy Leader of the Council may not be members of the Planning Committee; and the Chair of the Planning Committee may not be a member of the Policy Committee.

The Council agreed that there should be a substitutes' scheme for this Committee (3 per Group). Some substitutes may have to be members of the Select Committee, and this may have some bearing on elements of scrutiny work that the substitute participates in. In particular, a Member cannot scrutinise a decision that they have been directly involved in making.

2. **Select Committee** – This comprises 12 Members, and will undertake the overview and scrutiny function. The membership will be politically proportional and members of it will not serve on the Policy Committee, except as named substitutes, and then may not scrutinise a decision that they have been involved in making. Membership of this Committee is not open to the Chair of the Council.

The Chair and Vice-Chair of this Committee will be appointed by the Council on the recommendation of the Selection Committee. The Committee can appoint up to two working groups at any one time to undertake reviews in whatever form is decided to be appropriate.

3. **Recruitment and Appeals Panel** – This will comprise 3 Members (with 1 or 2 substitutes, depending on the type of business) selected from a pool of 10 nominated by the Political Group Leaders and will meet as and when required. The only restriction is that the Solicitor to the Council and Monitoring Officer must be satisfied that all those who sit on the Panel have had relevant recruitment and selection training.

4. **Regulatory Committees**

- (a) **Audit and Governance Committee** – Comprises 9 Members and membership will be politically proportional. The Chair and Vice-Chair will be appointed at the Annual Meeting of the Council, on the recommendation of the Selection Committee. The Chair to be independent of the Policy Element of the committee structure.
- (b) **Licensing Committee** – Comprises 12 Members and the membership will be politically proportional. The membership is not limited in any way by membership of the Policy Committee or the Select Committee. The Chair and Vice-Chair will be

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appointed at the Annual Meeting of the Council, on the recommendation of the Selection Committee.

The membership of this Committee also makes-up the pool of members for the Licensing and Appeals Sub-Committee, although it is restricted to those Members who have received relevant training. The Sub-Committee deals with contested licensing matters and usually meets during the day.

- (c) **Planning Committee** – Comprises 12 members and membership will be politically proportional. Council agreed that there should be a substitute arrangement for this Committee (2 per Group). Political Groups should seek, so far as is practicable, not to appoint Councillors to this Committee, who are also to be members of the Policy Committee. In particular, the Leader and the Deputy Leader of the Council may not be members of the Planning Committee; and the Chair of the Planning Committee may not be a member of the Policy Committee. The Chair and Vice-Chair of the Planning Committee will be appointed at the Annual Meeting of the Council, on the recommendation of the Selection Committee. Relevant training on planning matters should be undertaken before Members sit on this Committee or act as substitutes. The Committee normally meets on a Monday with site visits, if any, taking place in the morning and the actual meeting in the afternoon.

### 5. **Ethical (Regulatory) Committees**

**Standards Committee** – From 1 July 2012, membership has comprised of 5 Members of the Council appointed proportionally, and a maximum of 4 co-opted non-voting parish councillors. It is recommended that, so far as possible, the membership is made up of experienced 'back-bench' Members. The Chair and Vice-Chair will be appointed at the Annual Council Meeting, on the recommendation of the Selection Committee.

The membership of this Committee also makes-up the pool of members for the sub-committee of the Standards Committee. All members require relevant training. The Committee meets in the early evening, while the timing of sub-committee meetings varies depending on availability.

#### 1. Appointments to Committees

1.1 The Council will appoint the following committees, sub committees in order to effectively conduct the business of the Council:

- Recruitment Panel (3 from a pool of 10)

##### **Regulatory**

- Audit and Governance Committee (9)
- Licensing Committee (12) and its sub-committee (3 from the Licensing Committee)

- Standards Committee, (5, and 4 co-opted parish members plus 3 independent persons who do not sit as committee members).

1.2 Additionally, the Policy Committee may appoint “specific task” sub-committees and the Overview and Scrutiny Committee may have up to two working groups at any one time.

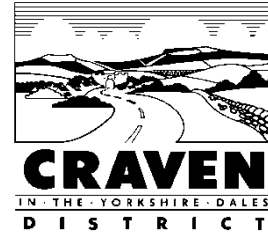
1.3 The following section repeats some of the information in Council Procedure Rules and gives guidelines for the constitution and appointment of all the bodies referred to above.

- (a) The membership of the bodies referred to in 1.1 above will be allocated to the Political Groups in accordance with the political balance of the Council at the time. Before the Annual Meeting of the Council each year, the Selection Committee will decide the numbers the Political Groups should appoint to each of them based upon the political proportionality of the Council.
- (b) The Selection Committee will recommend the appointment of committees and sub-committees in accordance with the nominations put forward by the Political Groups. In the absence of any formal grouping representing the interests of any Members, the Selection Committee will recommend the allocation of places for those Members, attempting to meet their preferences wherever possible.
- (c) The membership of the Policy Committee will include the Leader and Deputy Leader of the Council and, wherever possible, the Lead Members. The Chairman of the Planning Committee may not be a member of the Policy Committee. The Political Groups should seek, so far as is practicable, not to appoint Councillors, who are to serve on the Policy Committee, as members also of the Planning Committee. It shall be the usual practice that members of the Policy Committee should not be available for appointment to select working groups.
- (d) The Council will appoint 12 of its Members to the membership of the Select Committee. Those select committee members shall not be available for appointment as members of the Policy Committee, but they may act as substitutes for that Committee under the Council's scheme.
- (e) The Leader and Deputy Leader of the Council may not be members of the Planning Committee. The Chairman of the Planning Committee may not be a member of the Policy Committee. The Chairman of the Council and the Leader and Deputy Leader of

- the Council may not be members of the Select Committee. Members of Select will not serve on the Policy Committee, except as named substitutes
- (f) The Leader of the Council will Chair the Policy Committee and the Deputy Leader will be Vice-Chair. The Leader and Deputy Leader of the Council, the Chair and Vice-Chair of the Select Committee, and the Chair and Vice-Chair of the Audit and Governance, Licensing, Planning and Standards Committees, will be appointed by the Council Meeting.
  - (g) The Policy Committee may appoint “specific task” sub-committee with clear terms of reference and delegated authority to deal with specific issues of business. So far as is practicable, the number of members of these sub-committees should be no more than seven and will reflect the political balance of the Council. The membership of specific task sub-committees is open to all Members and places will be allocated to the Political Groups. The membership will be in accordance with the nominations submitted by each Group.
  - (h) The Select Committee may have up to two working groups of Members at any one time to deal with specific issues in the Committee’s annual work programme or any other matter referred to it by the Council, or the Policy Committee. These working groups do not have delegated authority, but they must reflect the political balance of the Council, excluding any co-opted members of the public. Working groups may only deal with business referred to them by the Select Committee.
  - (i) When a casual vacancy in the office of Councillor has been filled, or if a Member moves from one Political Group to another, the Chief Executive will inform the Group Leaders of any changes needed in the membership of any of the committees, sub-committees, groups or panels to reflect the political balance of the Council. Changes in membership of these bodies will take effect once the appointing body has approved the changes.
  - (j) Democratic Services will supply all Members with copies of agenda for the Policy Committee, the Select Committee, the Audit and Governance Committee, the Licensing Committee and the Planning Committee so that they can be aware if an issue relevant to their Ward appears on an agenda. This will be provided in paper form if the Member so requests. With the agreement of the relevant Chairman, any Member may speak at a meeting, but not vote. Any question as to the rights of a Ward Representative(s) to speak at a meeting shall be determined by the appropriate committee, sub-committee or group. *(Note: As sub-committees are to be appointed only for specific items of business, these rights will not apply.)*

- To report regularly at Council meetings on progress in each of their Priority areas.
- To draw up statements for Council Meetings in consultation with the lead director and the Leader of the Council.
- To respond to or deal with any issues arising at Council meetings relating to their respective roles.
- To play a key role in consultation on, and drawing up of, the revenue and capital budgets.
- To encourage continuous improvement, taking decisions on resources and priorities to deliver the strategies and budget approved by the Council promoting and participating in Councillor Development.
- To provide regular reports on progress and to undertake consultation on decisions as required.
- To act as an advocate for the Council within the authority and outside.
- To act as spokesperson within and outside the authority on those services and functions within their portfolio.
- To consult interested parties, ward and parish Councillors and citizens as part of the development and review of policy.
- To provide support to all Members to help them develop constructive roles as Ward Councillors.
- To abide by the Six Principles adopted by the Council and set out in the Local Code of Governance.
- To act upon the Values set out in 'Our Values.'
- To be responsible for personal development and undergo appropriate development and continuous improvement for any role undertaken.

#### Member Champion – Additional Responsibilities

- To promote the areas for which they are Champion by involving themselves locally in relevant issues.
- To act as a sounding board / adviser / critical friend for the Lead Officer in the relevant areas.
- To be the Council's public face in relation to each of those areas.
- To be encouraged to report to Council meetings at least once during each municipal year.

3. **Report**

  - 3.4 In recommending appointments / nominations to the outside bodies listed in Appendix A the Committee is asked to bear in mind the following from the Committee and Member Conventions in the Council's Constitution:  
  
*“The Council is invited to appoint representatives to sit on various types of outside bodies varying from statutory bodies to local voluntary groups. This Section sets out the procedure for making those appointments.*  
  
*(a) Appointments of representatives of the Council to outside bodies are made at the Annual Council Meeting each year following recommendations from the Selection Committee. At any other time of the year, the Policy Committee makes decisions on appointments to outside bodies.*

(b) *In recommending appointments to outside bodies as a whole, the Selection Committee will attempt to ensure that appointments are made in accordance with the relevant category agreed by the Council, as follows:*

- *Ward-Based Appointments to be made (unless otherwise agreed) from the Members representing the Wards indicated;*
- *Appointments to go with Office of Leader / Deputy Leader / other office; and*
- *Overall Appointments to which Political Proportionality is to be applied.”*

#### 4. **Implications**

4.1 **Financial Implications** – Attendance at outside bodies is considered to be part of Elected Members’ duties. Travelling and subsistence expenses can be claimed under the Council’s Members’ Allowances Scheme.
